She shares these playful, cunning and unpredictable characters, weaving humor and wisdom to leave us with wonder, inspiration and laughter.

Maggie Lott loves to tell folktales coming from the American South, her home in her growing up years. She feels drawn to the tales of the African American and the Appalachian traditions. She especially loves the trickster tales of Brer Rabbit and the humor of the European Jack tales preserved in the Southern Mountains.

She's been telling these tales with the **South Sound Story Guild** in Olympia for 20+ years. And with her classes of 2nd and 3rd graders. When Maggie reads a Southern tale, she hears the voice of the teller in her head. Then when she tells that story, she hears her long dormant Southern voice emerging. Maggie has also been exploring personal stories based on her Southern Heritage.
